

Powerful words and phrases to be used in Essay Writing – A Helping Guide

In order to [write my paper for me](#), the writer needs to be aware of the idea of formal language. He must know the right words to be used in the right places. These skills will be crucial to your success if you wish to make your career as a writer.

In the course of this article, we will try to provide you with the complete details regarding the use of powerful words and phrases in your essays. It is not a long list of words that you need to learn by heart. But hopeful, you will be able to memorize it as you practice your essay writing.



These are the words used by the writers when they want to explain a complex word in simpler terms for the understanding of the reader. Some of these words are as follows:

1. In order to: These words are used collectively for [write my essay for me](#) the explanation of the purpose of an argument

2. In other words: These words are used when the writer wants to explain a concept using different words that are comparatively simpler than the ones used before. It is also used to emphasize and expand a point
3. To put it another way: This phrase is simply another way of using "in other words" when you feel it you need different words to explain your points. These words are generally used by advanced writers who are familiar with the idioms and proverbs.
4. That is to say: These words are used if you wish to add more details to your explanations.
5. To that end: These words are used just as a writer would use "in order to" and "to this end".
6. Addition of information to support your arguments/points

Most of the students try to use different words in place of 'and' every time they wish to add anything new to the information that they have provided, or when they want to make a new argument in their essays. Let us discuss some of these words that can be used in this case

1. Moreover: This word is added at the start of the sentence to add extra information in support of a point you are making.
2. Furthermore: Moreover, this word is also used at the start of a sentence to add extra information
3. What's more: This word is also used in the same sense as moreover and furthermore
4. Likewise: You will use this word when you want to talk about something that agrees with what you have just mentioned.
5. Similarly: In most of the sense, it is used in the same manner as "likewise".
6. Another key thing to remember: This phrase can also be used as "another key point to remember" or "another key fact to remember" to introduce [write my essay](#) facts without using the word "also".
7. As well as: These words are used in place of "also" or "and".
8. Not only...but also: This phrase is used to add extra information in a way that is more surprising than the first piece of information cited before it.
9. Coupled with: These words are used when considering two or more arguments at a time.
10. Not to mention/ to say nothing of: The words "Not to mention" and "to say nothing of" can be used to add additional information with a bit of stress on the importance of the facts provided in your essay.
11. Words used for highlighting a contrast

When you are providing an argument in [write essay for me](#), you would need to present opinions that are often contradicting or contrasting. Let us discuss a few words that would serve this purpose when you write your own essays

1. However: You can use the word "however" to introduce a point that disagrees with what you've just said.
2. On the other hand: The usage of this phrase consists of presenting a contrasting interpretation of the same part of the evidence, a different part of the evidence that proposes something else, or an opposing opinion.
3. Having said that: These words are in the same way as "on the other hand" or the word "but".
4. By contrast/ in comparison: Use "by contrast" or "in comparison" when you're comparing and contrasting pieces of evidence.
5. Then again: These words are used to cast a sense of assertion or doubt.
6. That said: These words are used in a similar way as "then again".
7. Yet: Use these words when you are about to introduce a contrasting idea.
8. Adding a proviso or acknowledging reservations

Sometimes, you may need [essay writing service](#) to admit a short falling in a piece of evidence, or add a proviso. Here are some ways of doing that in your essay

1. Despite this: You can use the words “despite this” if you wish to outline a point that stands out of your composition regardless of a short falling in the evidence to support it.
2. With this in mind: These words are used when the reader considers a point in the relation to an argument that you are trying to make
3. Provided that: This phrase is used when the argument presented by the writer is in line with his previous arguments
4. In view of: This phrase is used when the writer is trying to join two arguments together.

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
